
The Microloan Program

The College Internship Program

During 2012 The Guatemalan Project benefited from the visits of various students coming from Boston High School, Wellesly College, Indiana State University and Harvard University. Students visited with families in El Triunfo and became aware of some of their needs. Some of the students have addressed the challenges of the families by either continuing social programs or starting programs that benefit all people of El Triunfo.

We hope to have the students' continued support and invite students from other colleges to join us in our effort to making opportunities for all people viable.

The Computer Lab Program

On February 21, 2013 the Guatemalan Project and the Gualan Municipal High School (Instituto Diversificado Municipal) celebrated the initiation of the first Computer Lab at the High School. Thanks to the generous donations from Seabord Marine, Hands on Tzedakah, Inc., Robert J. Ross, Patricia Hall, and Mair Xion the Guatemalan Project purchased nine computers Compaq Presario CQ43-402LA NOTEBOOK PC. The cost of the nine computers was \$5,000.00 at \$555.00 each.

We are grateful to the donors who made possible the purchase of the computers, to the Governor of Zacapa for providing a classroom for the computer, to the Municipality of Gualan for donating the tables, chairs, and a secured cabinet where all laptops will be kept safe, and to the students of the electrical program at the High School for making all the necessary electrical connections.

At present there are over 200 High School students at the Municipal High School. We hope that in a very near future, more computers could be made available so that all students may have, at least, two hours of computing time per week.

The Municipal High School is the only high school in the region where students do not have to pay tuition. Students come to the school from faraway places in the municipality and all of them are of very low income.

Mr. Mathew Pewler and a group of his friends from New York will be visiting El Triunfo for the third time. The group works with families of very low income and, together build one house at a time. So far, three houses have been built for three families and another one is in the planning for this year. We thank the generosity and commitment of the Matt group and invite others to follow.

A total of 1,714 Quetzales (\$220.59 USD) was received as contributions from the people of El Triunfo who obtained loans throughout 2012.

In an effort of promoting savings for education, children are encouraged to save. The Guatemalan Project matches the amount saved by students so children can enter high school. In 2012 students saved a collective amount of 9,628 Quetzales (\$1,239.12 USD). Our savings program has even enabled students to save and purchase laptops for school.
